

2026 WCRC Ramp Game Sheet Guide

1. Install Ramp Game Sheet App via App Store or Google Play

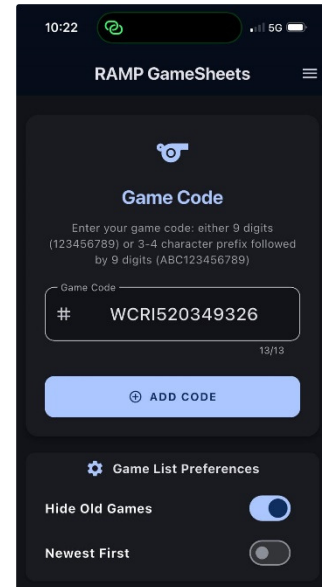
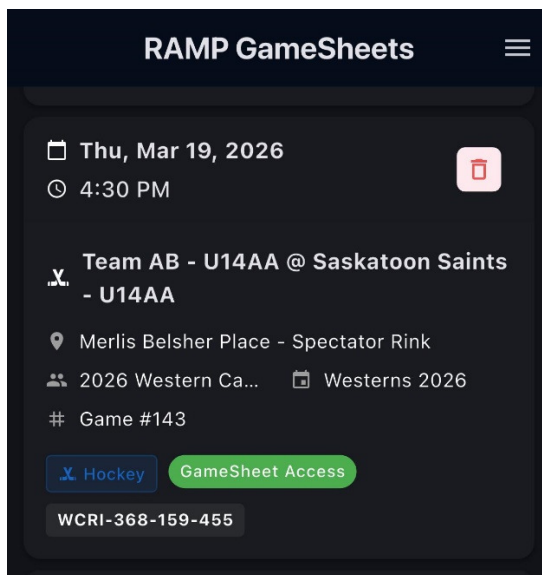
Each person who will be using the app will need to create an account on the App. This is the same login / password as the RAMP TeamApp, if you have used this previously or for other sports. This account must be your own unique account and should be linked to your email.

2. Add the Game Codes to your Phone

Game codes can be found at the command center. The scorekeeper will require the 'Game Sheet' code. These codes are different then the home and away code a team manager needs to assign their roster to the scoresheet.

After entering the code, hit 'Add Code' and the game will be added to your app.

The game sheet will appear in your app as follows:

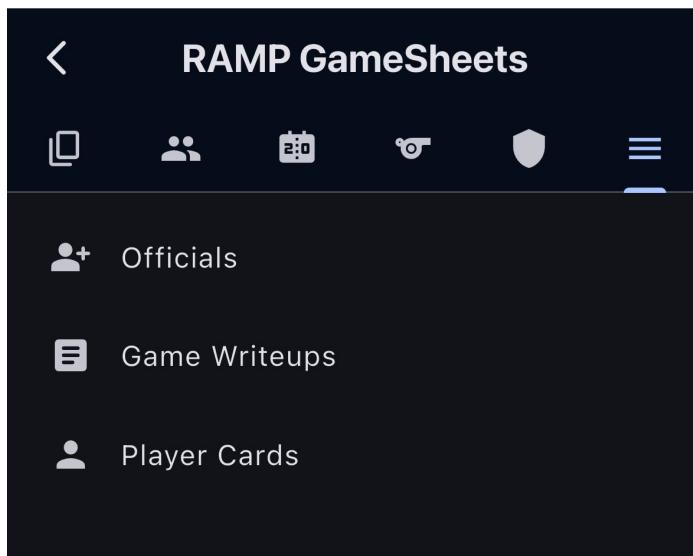
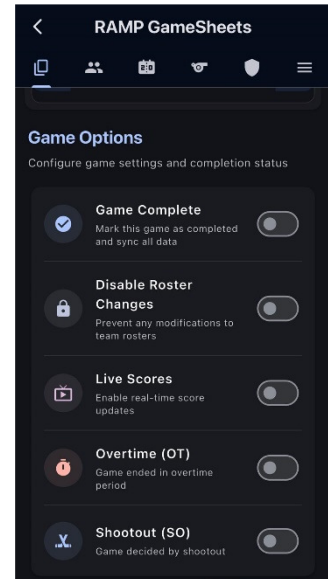
3. Before Game

After you select the game, it will ask if you want to do 'Online Mode' or 'Offline mode'. If your phone has decent service it is recommended to do 'Online Mode' so the game is updated live online.

Before the game make sure that each teams, goalie is added. This is how goalie save percentage is calculated.

You will also need to check off 'Live Scores'

Minor officials (score keeper, time clock, shot clock) need to be added to the game sheet. These are added by clicking on the 3 lines and going to officials. These should be done prior to the game.



4. Scorekeeping

During the game a paper and pen will be available in the score box. It is recommended to write down what the ref says before entering it into the game sheet app.

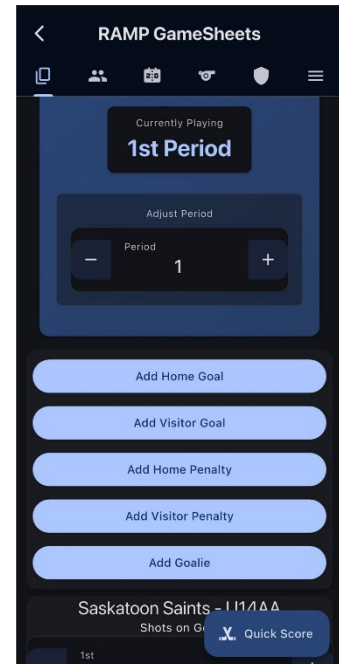

The main tab of the Game Sheet will look like this.
You may have to scroll down to see this part of the screen.
Across the top are different tabs (main window, rosters, goals, penalties). All actions for the score keeper can be done from the main view.

During the game you can use 'Add Home / Visitor Goal' and 'Add Home / Visitor Penalty'. Once you click on these buttons it will give you a list of players and you can define goals/assist or penalty reason.

5. Shots on Net

Shots are being tracked by the penalty box worker.

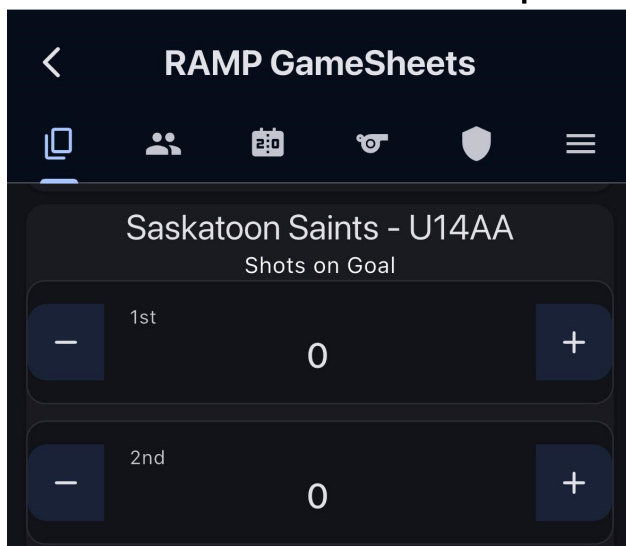


A shot on goal will follow Ringette Canada Rules (24.1) *where a shot on goal is taken when the team in possession of the ring legally propels the ring toward the other team's goal and:*

- a) *The ring enters the net.*
- b) *The ring contacts a goal post or crossbar*
- c) *The ring contacts the goaltender or AGK within the goal crease*
- d) *The ring contacts the goaltender outside the goal crease and that contact prevents the ring from entering the net.*

Shots need to be entered into the game sheet. On the main window if you scroll down you will find where to enter shots. It is recommended to add them after every period.

6. Ending a Game

Once the game is complete and you have entered in all shots, ask the official if they want to check the game sheet. Some officials may need to sign the game sheet on your phone but most should be able to use their own phone with an 'official code'

Click off 'Game Complete'. You can then exit the game sheet. When exiting the Game sheet it will ask you to sign the game sheet as the scorekeeper.
