<b>Policy Name</b>	<b>Emergency Injury Action Plan Policy</b>

### Policy Statement

BC Soccer believes in the health, safety and wellness of all BC Soccer participants and ensuring the necessary planning, awareness and documentation must be in place to manage emergencies should they arise during sanctioned soccer activity across BC.

### Purpose

To ensure the health, safety, and wellness of all participants by having in place a plan to help manage injury emergency.

### Standards

1. All BC Soccer members and affiliated organizations must have a documented Emergency (Injury) Action Plan for all training and game activities, that take into consideration the different locations that soccer activities occur.
2. All Emergency (Injury) Action Plan's must be available to all participants, coaches, staff and activity leaders for all locations.
3. All Emergency (Injury) Action Plan's must be reviewed and updated annually.

### Definitions

Emergency (Injury) Action Plan: An Emergency Action Plan assigns clear roles and responsibilities for responding to an emergency as well stores information needed to respond to an emergency. Source: National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP), Emergency Action Plan Module. 2022
