

Call-Up Policy for Underaged Players

- Teams may call up a maximum of four players born in 2010 to achieve a total game-day roster of 13 players.
- All players born in 2010 must complete a waiver prior to their first game. By signing, players agree to:
 - Participate in a women's league
 - Uphold sportsmanship and respect for opposing players
- If a call-up player (born 2010) receives two or more warnings for unsportsmanlike conduct, they, along with their Team Representative or Coach, must attend a mandatory review meeting with the SJSC committee to determine their continued eligibility in the league.

Incident Reporting Procedures

- Incident Report forms are available on the SJSC website and may only be submitted by Team Representatives to info@sjsoccer.ca.
- Team Representatives must observe a 24-hour waiting period before submitting an incident report to ensure the report is composed thoughtfully rather than emotionally. Reports submitted within 24 hours will not be accepted.
- The reporting team must formally notify the opposing team of their intent to file a report prior to submission.

Default Policy

- Effective Monday, June 8, 2026, teams must notify both info@sjsoccer.ca and the opposing team at least 48 hours before kick-off if they intend to default a game.
- If 48-hour notice is provided, the following default fees apply:
 - First default: \$100
 - Second default: \$200
 - Third default: \$300 and a mandatory meeting with the SJSC office
 - Subsequent defaults: \$500 each
- If less than 48 hours' notice is given, default fees are doubled:
 - First default: \$200
 - Second default: \$400
 - Third default: \$600 and a mandatory meeting with the SJSC office
- Default fees must be paid to info@sjsoccer.ca before the team's next game. Failure to pay will result in the cancellation of future games until fees are settled.
- Teams are responsible for their own default fees.
- It is recommended that teams establish a safety net fund to cover potential default fees. If unused, this fund may be used for a team social event at the end of the year. For the following season, it is suggested that all teams contribute an additional \$500, which will be refunded if no defaults occur.
- All default fees collected will be donated to the Breast Cancer Foundation at the end of the season.
