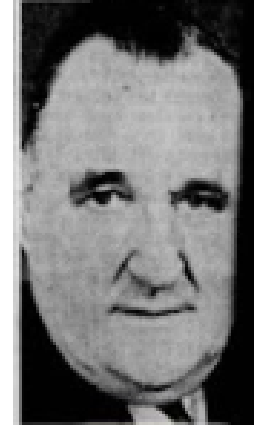


Cec White

1975 Inductee - Honorary Life Member



Cec White has been heavily involved in the softball world for many years. In 1944, Cec White was appointed BC Commissioner to the American Amateur Softball Association, and later that same year his fastball team competed in an exhibition game, further reflecting his growing influence in the sport.



In 1955, Cec was active in the Vancouver Junior and Juvenile League, seeking additional juvenile (U16) teams to expand the competitive circuit under his leadership. By 1960, he remained a driving force in the promotion of minor sports and had long been a key figure in local softball development. He was appointed organizer for the Metropolitan Community Council's initiative to promote minor sports, where he developed the organization's constitution and projected that 60–80 minor division teams would be participating in softball that summer.

In 1963, Cec served as the BC Softball Commissioner, representing BC at ASA meetings in Florida and advocated for Canadian Championships, international tournaments in Vancouver, and potential Japanese Women's Team tour. Cec was delegated to help form a Canadian Softball Association, and later sanctioned as commissioner.

Come 1965, he was elected President of the Canadian Amateur Softball Association and appointed R.P. (Pop) Simon as acting secretary-manager. He emphasized the importance of recreation and the development of sport, announcing a major softball clinic in Vancouver.

In 1972, he was elected as President and Vancouver City Commissioner at the Vancouver Metropolitan Amateur Softball Association annual meeting, continuing his leadership in the sport's governance and development.
