2001 Inductee - Athlete Category



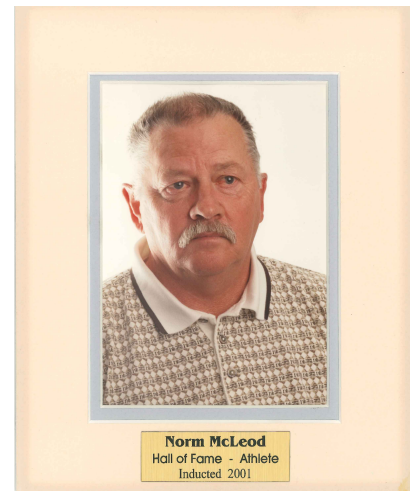
Norm McLeod played for notable teams including the Victoria Bates Construction team and New West IMI.

In 1972, he played for the New West IMI competing in the Senior A Men's league. In 1972, he was recognized as the 'Most Valuable Player' while playing catcher.

The following year in 1973, he recorded additional hits for the New Westminster Burdens, continuing to build his reputation as a consistent offensive contributor.

By 1974, he was selected to play with the Victoria Bates, where he played left field and was a consistent contributor at the plate. He continued with strong offensive production in 1977, adding more hits while with Victoria Bates.

In recognition of his contributions, consistent performance, and long-standing impact within competitive senior men's softball, he is hereby inducted into the Softball Hall of Fame as a player whose talent and dedication left a lasting mark on the game.
