

Peter Proctor

1989 Inductee - Athlete Category



Peter Proctor was a dominant pitcher who played for teams such as the Vancouver Firemen, and Pils throughout his fastball career. He was best known for his blazing fastball and scoreless innings.

In 1948, at the American Softball Association tournament held at Memorial Park, the Vancouver Firemen advanced to the finals following a 5-2 victory over Pacific Veneer. Peter held the Veneermen to just four hits, helping produce their win.

Proctor was a key contributor on the 1950 Vancouver Firemen's Major Men's Fastball team that competed in the first-ever Canadian Men's Fastball Championship, held at the Canadian National Exhibition grounds in Toronto.

In 1950, Peter captured the title at the Western Canada Softball Championships, crushing their opponents 15-0. Peter managed to add nine more scoreless innings to his total of 24 across the five game series. Not only was he an excellent pitcher, but his performance at the plate was equally impressive. Proctor contributed one hit and a double, helping bring his team to victory.

Fast-forward to 1954, Peter remained with the Vancouver Firemen, competing in the Major Men's Softball League, where he dominated the mound and consistently contributed at the plate. In 1957, he began playing in the Senior A Men's softball league with the Moody Park Pils. He led the league for home-runs with two long balls while also contributing a steady number of singles. Proctor pitched all three of their series wins, leading them to the league semi-finals.
