

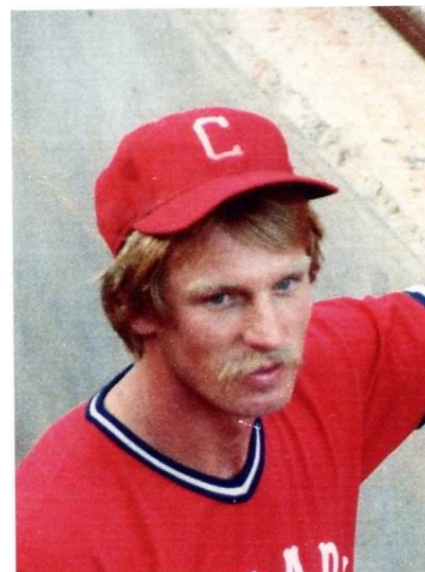
Rob Guenter

1995 Inductee - Athlete Category



Born in Saskatchewan, Rob Guenter was a fastball pitcher known for his many no-hitters. Throughout his career, he recorded 23 perfect games from 1973 to 1990. He joined the Saskatoon K&K Olson's, followed by the All-O-Matics in 1973. At 18 years old, he threw three no-hitters in his first season. In 1973 and 1976, he competed at the National Championships. Rob was selected as Saskatoon's Athlete of the Year in 1979, acknowledging his hard-work and talent.

He was selected to play for the Budgets in 1979, where they attended the Pan American Games. At the Pan Am Games, he threw a one-hitter and a perfect game, ultimately winning the tournament.



Rob moved to Victoria and collected two more National wins, achieving gold at the 1983 Pan Am Games. He competed at the 1983 Senior A Men's Canadian Championships, throwing five games over 24 hours, and collecting another National title. In both 1982 and 1983, he was named Victoria's Male Athlete of the Year. Softball BC is proud to honour his achievements by inducting him into the Softball BC Hall of Fame.
