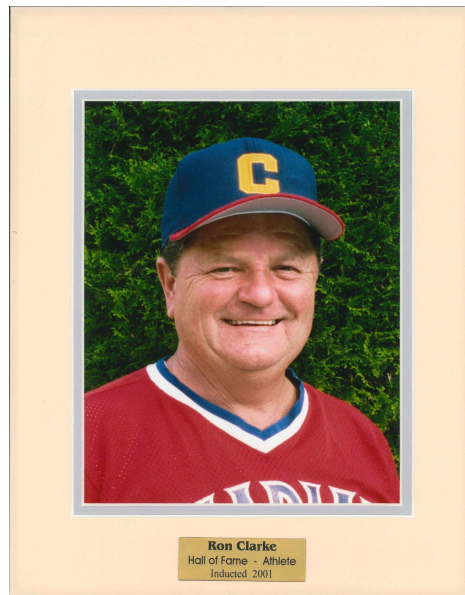


Ron Clarke

2001 Inductee - Athlete Category

Mr. Ron Clarke played Men's fastpitch at the highest level available. Ron was recognized for his speed on the field, capitalizing on this Ron became one of British Columbia's first slap hitters. Using speed to his advantage would prove to be an extremely effective tactic, Ron would bat .333 over 600 at-bats in the competitive South Memorial Senior Men's League. This includes a season with a .440 in 1966.

Playing for the Vancouver Blue Boy's, Ron would help contribute to the 1965 and 1966 Canadian Championships. In 1966 Ron would travel to Mexico City, competing in the first ISF World Championships. Following this appearance Ron would compete in the Pan American Games securing bronze for his efforts.
