In 1972, at the age of 22, Sandra joined the Green & Louie team, coached by Adrian Lavigne as the starting shortstop. After winning the 1973 Nationals, Green and Louie went on to represent Canada at the 1974 World Championships in Stratford Connecticut. From 1972 to 1979 as Doc's Blues, the team won an impressive 6 Nationals. In 1978, the team once again represented Canada at the World Championships in El Salvador. The Doc's Blues team was the last club team to represent Canada at the World Championships and were inducted into the Softball Hall of Fame in 1990 and into the Softball Canada Hall of Fame in 2004.



After taking time out to raise her three children, Sandra returned to actively playing in 1988 with the Vancouver Meraloma Masters team. The team won gold medals at the 1994 (Brisbane) and 1998 (Portland) World's Masters Games. Sandra continues to be active in the game, umpiring approximately 300 games a year.
