Ms. Tracey Huclack began her career in 1974, playing at the Junior level in North Vancouver. Soon after Tracey would join the extremely talented Doc's Blues in 1979, retiring from the team in 1988. The Doc's Blues with Tracey, demonstrated a great amount of success Nationally and Internationally.



While playing for the Doc's Blues, Tracey would take part in bringing home six Canadian Championships. During this time, Tracey was named MVP in 1988, and won the Top Batter Award, in 1987. Prior to these two accolades, Tracey would represent Team Canada in 1987 at the Pan Am Games, after joining the team in 1986. Tracey would continue to represent Team Canada again at the World Championships in 1990.

Tracey was not only an excellent player but went on to coach in the White Rock Renegades association from 1990-1996. Tracey demonstrates excellence both athletically and in leading the next generation of softball players. Softball BC recognizes Tracey's dedication to the sport by inducting her into the Softball BC Hall of Fame.
