

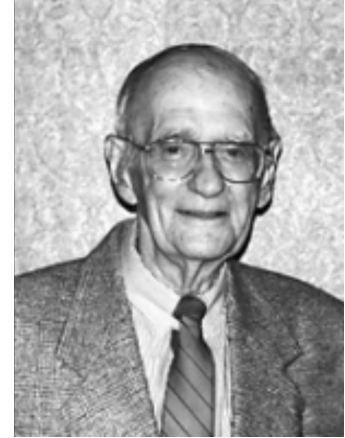
Ward Lloyd

1984 Inductee - Honorary Life Member



Softball BC President Lloyd presided from 1964 through 1970. Of course at that time, the organization was only known as the British Columbia Amateur Softball Association. Mr. Lloyd held the office of Softball Canada Commissioner for BC from 1966 to 1973, then was elected in 1973 for a term as Vice President of Softball Canada.

Ward began his softball career as an umpire progressing to coaching later. The coaching role probably had something to do with his two daughters. Ward's daughter Linda worked as Softball BC's administrative assistant and his son-in-law, Clifford "Duff" Slavin contributed to Softball BC and was inducted to the Softball BC Hall of Fame in 1992.



Mr. Ward Lloyd held the president's position when BC first affiliated with Softball Canada, instituted the first grant application to the provincial government, was softball tournament director for the first Canada Summer Games held in New Westminster and ignored the BC Registrar of Companies in 1964, when advised to declare bankruptcy. Thank you for believing and keeping this organization solvent as here we are 35 years later. Proof that you made the correct decision, Ward.

In 1967, The Federal Government, bestowed the Canada Medal to Mr. Lloyd for community as well as softball service.
