1. Each member of the Board, per Bylaw 5:02.1 shall have one (1) vote each at all meetings, except any current Softball NB staff or appointed members.
2. Each registered team in good standing shall have one (1) vote each at each Annual General Meeting.
3. Each Registered League in good standing, whose teams are all members of S.N.B. Inc. shall have one (1) vote at the Annual General Meeting granted to the league designate.
4. Each elected director of a Regional Association is to have one (1) vote at Softball New Brunswick Inc.'s Annual General Meeting excluding Regional Umpire Associations. (See Umpires Constitution 2:02)
5. Members 18 years of age or older and a member in good standing, ordinarily a resident in New Brunswick, shall be entitled to vote as per Bylaw 5:02.5

OPERATING GUIDELINES

1.1 General Overview

- a. Softball New Brunswick uses the 'Softball Canada Official Guide and Rule Book' for its interpretation in playing the game of Softball. **Modifications to the rules as stated herein take precedence over the Softball Canada Rule Book.** These Special Operating Rules (SOR's) will govern all Softball NB events (Provincial Championships and Eastern Canadian Qualifiers) and any Association/League disputes. Specific League rulings take precedent for League play regarding:
 - i. Game variances may include but are not limited to:
 1. Pitching rules
 2. Batting order
 3. Substitution
 4. Game length
- b. All affiliated Leagues, Associations and teams will have complete charge over their own operations and business, except in the case of:
 - i. A dispute, where any affiliated League, Association or team can appeal to Softball NB in writing through their respective League or Association following the Softball NB Appeals Policy.
 - ii. Provincial Championships or Eastern Canadian Qualifiers which are governed by Softball NB.

1.2 Definitions

- a. **Affiliate/Member:** An individual that has completed Softball New Brunswick current annual registration and paid the associated fees.
- b. **Association:** A group of volunteers, whether incorporated as a Non-Profit Corporation or not, organized to administer the operation of softball within the Province of New Brunswick and in accordance with the Bylaws and Operating Rules of Softball New Brunswick. The group will be administering softball within a community or region. Associations that affiliate with Softball New Brunswick will have all rights allotted by Softball New Brunswick. A softball association may have players registered with it in one or more recognized divisions or categories and may operate one or more teams. All teams in an Association must have common signing officers for the purpose of registration and releases and provide this information to the Executive Director of Softball New Brunswick. Any changes in the officers of an Association set up must be forwarded to the Executive Director of Softball New Brunswick as they occur.
- c. **League:** A combination of teams affiliated with Softball New Brunswick through their respective Associations or with another Province that is a member of Softball Canada who compete among themselves based on a regular schedule of games established by an elected or appointed group of individuals affiliated with Softball New Brunswick.
- d. **Teams:** A group of registered players and coaches forming one side in a competitive game or sport.



2. MEMBERSHIP REGISTRATION

2.1 General Information

- a. Annual Membership Registration with Softball New Brunswick is done online through our website at www.softballnb.ca via RAMP Interactive.
- b. The term of membership shall begin upon registration and payment of annual fees. The term of membership is from April 1st to March 31st.
- c. To be covered by the Softball New Brunswick Insurance Program, players, coaches, umpires, on-field helpers and managers on teams must be registered with Softball New Brunswick **prior to any indoor or outdoor softball activity**.
- d. Membership Fee Structure is determined by the Board of Directors by February 15th of the current season.

3. COACHES, MANAGERS & VOLUNTEERS

3.1 Minimum Requirements

- a. **ALL Coaches** listed on the team roster for minor teams are required to be affiliated with Softball New Brunswick and must adhere to the following minimum coaching standards:
 - i. Safe Sport Training if 14 or older.
 - [Free via The Locker](#)
 - ii. Foundations of Coaching Softball (FOCS) – Part 1
 - \$20 [via The Locker](#)
 - iii. Foundations of Coaching Softball (FOCS) – Part 2
 - \$25 [via The Locker](#)
 - iv. Vulnerable Sector Check (To be renewed every 3 years) if 18 or older.
 - Submitted via RAMP Profile or to m.diercks@softballnb.ca
- b. **ALL Managers, on-field volunteers, off-field volunteers and Executives** are required to be affiliated with Softball New Brunswick and must adhere to the following standards
 - i. Safe Sport Training if 14 or older.
 - [Free via The Locker](#)
 - ii. Vulnerable Sector Check (To be renewed every 3 years) if 18 or older.
 - Submitted via RAMP Profile or to m.diercks@softballnb.ca

3.2 Provincial Championship Coaching Requirements

- a. **U9 and U11 Divisions**
 - i. All coaches will be required to meet the Coaching Minimum Requirements only
- b. **U13-U19/20 A Divisions**
 - i. A minimum of one (1) coach on the Provincial Championship Roster is required to be have completed Competition-Introduction Weekend #1
 - ii. All additional coaches are required to meet the Coaching Minimum Requirements only
- c. **U13-U19/20 AA Divisions**
 - i. A minimum of one (1) coach on the Provincial Championship Roster is required to be have completed Competition-Introduction Weekend #1 and Weekend #2
 - *Making Ethical Decisions only needs to be completed if attending Easterns or Canadians.*
 - ii. All additional coaches are required to meet the Coaching Minimum Requirements only

**d. Adult Divisions**

- i. All coaches must complete Safe Sport Training.
 - [Free via The Locker](#)

e. Team Managers and On-Field Helpers (those with direct athlete contact)

- i. Must complete Minimum Requirements (3.1.b)

3.3 Eastern Canadian Softball Championship Coaching Requirements

a. U13-U19/20 Divisions

- i. A minimum of one (1) coach on the Eastern Canadian Softball Championship Roster is required to be a minimum of Competition-Introduction [TRAINED](#).
- ii. All additional coaches are required to meet the Coaching Minimum Requirements only

3.4 Canadian Championship Coaching Requirements

a. U15-U19/20 Divisions

- i. A minimum of one (1) coach on the Canadian Championship Roster is required to be a minimum of Competition-Introduction [CERTIFIED](#).
- ii. All additional coaches are required to be a minimum of Competition-Introduction [TRAINED](#).

3.5 Canada Games Coaching Requirements

- a. The Head Coach on the Canada Games Roster is required to be Competition-Development [CERTIFIED](#).
 - i. Must achieve by February 1, the year of the Canada Games
- b. The Assistant Coach and Manager on the Canada Games Roster is required to be a minimum of Competition-Development [TRAINED](#).
 - i. Must achieve by February 1, the year of the Canada Games

4. PLAYING RULES

4.1 General Playing Rules

Softball New Brunswick uses the 'Softball Canada Official Guide and Rule Book' for its interpretation in playing the game of Softball. **Modifications to the rules as stated herein take precedence over the Softball Canada Rule Book.** These Special Operating Rules (SOR's) will govern all Softball NB events (Provincial Championships and Eastern Canadian Qualifiers) and any Association/League disputes.

Softball New Brunswick does NOT use the Minor Softball rules at the back of the Softball Canada Rule Book.

We highly recommend teams use the Softball NB Special Operating Rules throughout their season in preparation for the Eastern Canadian Qualifiers (if applicable), Provincial Championships, etc

All other rules not listed in the SOR's will revert back to the Softball Canada Rule Book.

5. ELIGIBILITY

5.1 Player Eligibility

- a. **MINOR** Players aged U9 to and including U15, are eligible to play in their respective age category and the one (1) age category above theirs only.
- b. **MINOR** 'AA' athletes can only play with 'AA' teams in the one (1) age category above theirs. 'AA' Athletes cannot play with an 'A' team at the age category above.
- c. All U17 athletes and above are eligible to play in any adult division. U17 athletes must receive permission from Softball NB before committing to play in an open adult division.



5.2 Residency

- a. Players and Coaches registered with Softball New Brunswick are required to be a resident of New Brunswick as of May 1st of the current playing year. Players and Coaches registered on teams in categories which lead to a Canadian Championship must adhere to the Softball Canada Residency Rule of May 1st.
 - i. Softball NB staff reserves the right to review any residency requests past the May 1st deadline.
 - ii. Players must be able to produce a valid proof of residence (Ex. NB Drivers License, Utility Bill, Lease, etc.) if requested by Softball New Brunswick.

- b. Athlete Releases
 - i. A minor aged athlete is required to play within their region for the following events: Eastern Canadian Qualifiers and Provincial Championships. If no teams exist in the region in which a player resides, they can submit a request for release.
 - 1. Requests for releases are required to be submitted between April 22 - May 6, 2026.
 - a. [Minor Regional Release Procedure and Requirements](#)

 - ii. **ADULT** Players can play with any team within New Brunswick. Adults may request a release to play outside of the province for Canadian Championships. An individual's first priority is to any team from New Brunswick attending the event. The goal of the adult release policy is to allow additional opportunities for New Brunswick athletes to compete at a Canadian Championship, while ensuring New Brunswick teams have first priority to New Brunswick athletes.

- c. Service personnel and dependents such as penitentiary guards, mounted police or armed forces personnel transferred into New Brunswick after July 1st are allowed to play in Provincials; subject to review by the Executive Director

5.4 Proof of Age

- a. A request for proof of age may be made in the form of a copy of Birth Certificate, Passport, or a valid form of New Brunswick identification.
 - a. Members should be prepared to present a valid proof of age at any time during Qualifiers or Provincial Championships.

5.5 Softball NB Provincial Championships - Minor Team Eligibility

- a. All teams (players and coaches/staff) registering for Provincial Championships must first be registered with Softball New Brunswick. Softball New Brunswick Staff or designate, reserves the right to refuse any registration in Provincial Championships and has the authority to re-categorize teams, if deemed necessary.
- b. If a team wants to play in a secondary Provincial Championship:
 - i. Teams are required to play within their own age category first (or be registered and paid to do so should their respected provincials come afterwards)
 - ii. Teams may request to play in a secondary Provincial Championship one age category and division above their own, at the discretion of Softball New Brunswick

5.6 Softball NB Provincial Championships - Minor Player Eligibility

- a. All players & coaches/staff on a Provincial Championship roster must first be registered with Softball New Brunswick.
- b. **MINOR** players up to and including U15 who wish to play a secondary Provincial Championship may only play the next age group above theirs.
 - i. A player's date of birth establishes their age category for playing in a Provincial Championship or playing up a Provincial Championship.
 - 1. Ex. An athlete born in 2013/2014 falls within the U13 age group (in 2026).
 - a. U13 'A' athletes may play in U15 'A' or U15 'AA'.
 - b. U13 'AA' athletes may play in U15 'AA'.
 - ii. Female athletes are eligible to attend male designated tournaments, but age group rules still apply.
- c. **MINOR** Players aged U17 and up are able to play as many Provincial Championships available to them. To be eligible to attend an **ADULT** Provincial Championship, the player's DOB must fall within the U17 age group and also receive permission from Softball NB before committing to play.
 - i. Ex. Athletes born in 2009/2010 may play Adult Provincials in 2026 with permission from Softball NB.

7.2 Eastern Canadian Softball Championship Qualifiers

- a. NB has two (2) positions in each division of ECSC. Additional positions may be granted by the ECSC Committee on a case-by-case basis. (ex. If another province chooses to only send 0-1 teams).
- b. Teams interested in attending ECSC must register for Eastern Canadian Qualifiers to attend
 - i. By registering for qualifiers, teams are also committing to participate at the ECSC, should they qualify.
 - ii. Teams will be required to submit payment of \$1000 within 5 days of qualifying for Easterns. The fee will include:
 1. \$500.00 Eastern Canadian Registration Fee
 2. \$500.00 Performance Bond - to be refunded following the completion of the Eastern Canadian tournament pending the team fulfills their commitment to attend and there are no issues.
- c. Teams are required to play in their own age category.
- d. An athlete must be listed as a player on the line-up card and play in one (1) full inning in order to be considered on a teams roster for qualifiers
 - i. If an athlete does not meet these requirements, they will NOT be considered as part of a roster and will only be eligible to attend ECSC as a pick-up.
- e. Schedule
 - i. If there are 3 or more teams interested in attending ECSC, a tournament style qualifier will be held the first weekend in July each year.
 - ii. The schedule format will follow the same template as Provincial Championships with the exception of 3rd/4th place games will be played in all divisions.
 1. [Schedule Formats and Templates](#)
 - iii. If there are 2 teams interested in attending ECSC, one (1) game will be held as a qualifier to determine the higher the seed for ECSC (NB1 / NB2) . Qualifier registration fee will be partially refunded.
 - iv. If only 1 team is interested in attending ECSC, no qualifier will be held and that team will automatically attend as NB1. Qualifier registration fee will be refunded.
- f. Prizes and Awards
 - i. Prizes
 1. The top two (2) teams in each division will receive a Rawlings Prize Pack
 - ii. Individual Awards
 1. A plaque will be provided for each award winner.
 2. Individual awards will be awarded at each age category.
 3. The Softball New Brunswick Representative, in conjunction with the Tournament Chair, will determine the individual award winners based on the following criteria:
 4. Top Batter
 - a. Top Batter will be named based off of all round robin games only.



- b. To qualify, a player must have an average of 2.5 plate appearances or higher per game their team plays in the round robin.
 - c. Factors that may be considered when determining top batter include but are not limited to: batting average, on-base percentage, number of hits, strike-outs and walks.
5. Top Pitcher
- a. Top Pitcher will be named based off of all round robin games only.
 - b. U13: To qualify, a player must have pitched a minimum of 5 innings in round robin.
 - c. U15+: To qualify, a player must have pitched a minimum of 7 innings in round robin.
 - d. Factors that may be considered when determining top pitcher include but are not limited to: Innings pitched, batting average against, ERA, WHIP, number of hits against, strikeouts and walks.
6. Most Valuable Player (MVP)
- a. MVP will be based off of the entire tournament (Round Robin and Playoff Round)
7. The Softball NB Representative and Tournament Supervisor has final say on award winners.

7.3 ECSC Pickup Players

- a. Teams qualifying for an Eastern Canadian Tournament can add up to two (2) pickups as per the [ECSC By-laws](#)
- b. A player whose team does not play in the Eastern Canadian Qualifier may still be eligible to be picked up so long as they are a registered member in good standing with Softball New Brunswick.
- c. Procedure
 - i. The pickup process used by Softball New Brunswick will begin at the U13 age category, followed by U15, U17 and U19/20
 - ii. Pick-ups are completed one (1) at a time basis (e.g. Eastern Canadian Qualifier winner picks one (1); then next runner-up picks (1) and so on). If 3 teams are attending, the third team is added into the rotation for pick ups.
 - 1. A pick-up player refusing to play with a team loses their right to be picked up a second time.
 - 2. A player from a lower age category can be picked up by a team 1 age group higher.
 - 3. Pick-ups for Easterns will begin the first Wednesday following after the completion of the Eastern Canadian Qualifier. Pick-ups must be finalized no later than August 1st, at 11:59pm.



8. CANADIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

8.1 Minor Categories

- a. On an annual basis, Softball New Brunswick will send one (1) team to Canadian Championships in each of the minor age divisions as part of the NB Selects Provincial Team Program.
 - i. U15 Men's and Women's
 - ii. U17 Men's and Women's
 - iii. U19 Women's
 - iv. U20 Men's
- b. Considerations may be made to send one (1) additional team in any minor category, depending on the location of the tournament and overall needs of the NB Selects program.

8.2 Adult Fast Pitch Categories

- a. On an annual basis, Softball New Brunswick will authorize up to a maximum of two (2) qualifying club teams to attend the Canadian Championships in each of the adult categories:
 - i. U23 Men's
 - ii. Women's
 - iii. Men's
 - iv. Master Men's
- b. The date for adult teams to submit their intent to participate in the upcoming Canadian Championships to Softball New Brunswick are as follows:
 - i. May 1, 2026
- c. Considerations may be made to send one (1) additional team in any adult category, depending on the location of the tournament, quantity and quality of players.
- d. Pickups
 - i. See Softball Canada Fast Pitch Special Operating Rules (SOR's) for more information.

8.3 Adult Slo-Pitch Categories

- a. On an annual basis, Softball New Brunswick will authorize up to a maximum of one (1) qualifying club teams to attend the Canadian Championships in each of the adult categories:
 - i. Women's Slo-Pitch
 - ii. Men's Slo-Pitch



- b. The date for adult teams to submit their intent to participate in the upcoming Canadian Championships to Softball New Brunswick are as follows:
 - i. December 8, 2025
- c. Considerations may be made to send one (1) additional team in any adult category, depending on the location of the tournament, quantity and quality of players.
- d. Pickups
 - i. See Softball Canada Slo-Pitch Special Operating Rules (SOR's) for more information.

8.4 Additional Canadian Championship Information (Softball Canada)

- a. All information regarding Canadian Championships can be found in the [Team Guide](#) and on the [Softball Canada website](#).

9. TRAVEL PERMITS

- a. All affiliated teams, players and umpires that travel outside of New Brunswick to a SANCTIONED competition or tournament must be in possession of a travel permit in order to be covered under the Softball New Brunswick Insurance program.
- b. Travel permit request forms can be found and submitted through your RAMP Profile under “Permits, Sanctions and Forms”
 - i. Permits must be submitted a minimum of 7 business days prior to departure. Permits submitted less than 7 business days prior to departure will be charged a \$50.00 administrative fee. No travel permits will be accepted less than 2 business days prior to departure.

10. TOURNAMENT SANCTIONING

- a. All tournaments must be sanctioned by Softball New Brunswick. No tournament will be sanctioned unless the tournament committee or Association is an affiliated member of Softball New Brunswick.
- b. All Softball New Brunswick/Softball Canada rules & regulations shall apply.
- c. No sanctioned tournament shall accept entries from any team which is not an affiliated member of Softball New Brunswick or any other Provincial Softball Association. It will be the responsibility of the tournament organizers to ensure that all teams participating in their tournament are affiliated with Softball New Brunswick or another Provincial Softball Association.



- d. Any registered team, player, and coach/staff taking part in an unsanctioned tournament will NOT be covered under the Softball New Brunswick insurance policy.
- e. All games in a sanctioned tournament shall be umpired by registered umpires in New Brunswick.
- f. Should any team withdraw from a sanctioned tournament after the entry has been accepted, the team shall be reported to Softball New Brunswick for disciplinary action if deemed necessary.
- g. No tournament sanctions will be issued that conflict with any Provincial Championships, Eastern Qualifiers or Eastern Canadian Championships scheduled for the same dates.
- h. Tournaments should follow Softball NB's team classification when inviting teams to participate in their event. (i.e., U15 or Men's/Women's, 'A' or 'AA', etc.)
- i. All irregularities, problems, conflicts, etc., must be reported to the Softball New Brunswick Office no later than five (5) days after completion of the tournament.
- j. Application for a tournament sanction must be made at least two (2) weeks prior to the tournament date. Sanctioned tournaments will be posted on the Softball New Brunswick website.

Ejection Reports

- a. During a game involving registered Softball NB members, the umpire(s) may be required to eject a player, coach, or even a spectator from a game for various reasons. It is the responsibility of the umpire to then report the ejection directly to Softball NB within the appropriate timeline.
- b. Link to [Ejection Report Form](#)
- c. Steps to reporting an ejection:
 - i. Ejection reports must be completed by game official(s) no later than 24 hours after the ejections have occurred. This form will be sent to Regional Umpire In Chief (RUIC), Softball NB Regional Director, Provincial Umpire in Chief (PUIC) and Softball NB Executive Director.
 - ii. Regional UIC and Softball NB Regional Director will administer the punishment based on Softball NB discipline policy's guideline (link here). If the offense warrants more than the outlined minimum penalty, the PUIC and Softball NB Executive Director will be included in the process.
 - iii. If conflict of interest is declared by either the Regional UIC or Regional Director, their replacement will be appointed by the PUIC/Executive Director.
